A pathway to employment for local young people











Summary

The Youth Mentoring Career Pathways (YMCP) program brokers relationships between marginalised young people and mentors within the local community.

These relationships provide young people that are unemployed or under-employed with an opportunity to develop professional networks, new skills and hands-on experience to help kick start their career path.

Young people can choose to participate in the following opportunities:

- Mentor program for a minimum 9 months
- Skill building workshops

Since 2017 the YMCP program has supported over **200 young people** with their employment and education goals.

Outcomes from the program include **70%** of young people gaining employment during or post program (3 year evaluation – 2020).





For mentors

Become a Mentor

Most of us want someone to look over our resume, or to talk to before a job interview. If you arrived here from another country with limited English, or if you are a young person who hasn't experienced life outside your own suburb, that kind of support is invaluable.

What can you offer?

Mentors have a genuine interest in supporting young people and are willing to share their life skills. Mentors come from a variety of backgrounds – currently employed, retired from full time work, parents, business people or someone who has great industry contacts.

We are looking for mentors who are:

- Good listeners
- Non-judgmental
- Supportive role models
- Show unconditional positive regard

Who are our mentees?

Our mentees are aged 16-24 and come from a diverse range of backgrounds and abilities who are unemployed or under-employed.





What do you gain?

Volunteering is extremely satisfying, personally as well as professionally. The skills gained through volunteering are diverse and relevant to many fields of work.

Mentors are able to make a difference in a young person's life, whilst gaining skills in:

- Leadership
- Problem solving
- Interpersonal skills
- Communication
- Negotiation skills
- Active listening
- Creative thinking

What support and training do I receive?

- Mentor training
- Mentor debrief sessions
- Access to our online community of mentors
- Professional development
- Support from the YMCP Coordinator

What is the commitment?

The time commitment is 2 hours per fortnight for 9 months. Interested applicants are required to:

- Complete an expression of interest form
- Participate in an interview
- Attend mentor training
- Successfully complete documents:
 - 1. National Police check
 - 2. Working with Children check
 - 3. Policies and Code of Conduct.

Please note that our matching process can take a few months after the Mentor Training. We appreciate applicants patience.
