What is SWL?

The Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) program is a Victorian Government initiative which aims to address skill shortages, identify short-term and long-term training opportunities for young people and prepare students for the workforce.

The SWL Program is delivered by the 31 Local Learning and Employment Networks (LLENs) across the state and funded by the Victorian Department of Education and Training (DET). The Hume Whittlesea LLEN works with local employers and secondary schools to:

- Source placements for students studying VET or VCAL that could potentially lead to an apprenticeship or full-time employment
- Train teachers and prepare students on industry employment needs and employer expectations and priorities
- Make teachers and students aware of those elements that add value to employers and their business
- Update and maintain the SWL Statewide Portal by ensuring all advertised placements are current and taken up by students.

SWL related activities

Job ready presentations and portal training

Targeted presentations are delivered to VCAL and VET classes to prepare students for their placement prior to commencing. The presentations help to increase student confidence about the process of approaching employers, including how best to prepare and present at an interview, and how they can best stand out. Understanding employer expectations is also discussed as an important requirement in preparing students for the world of work. Portal training is offered during these presentations which includes information on how best to find a placement that matches their skills, aspirations and alignment to their VET/VCAL studies.

Teacher Portal training

Teacher portal training and information is offered to, and conducted with, VCAL/VET staff within schools. This makes it possible for teachers to use accurately both the public portal and the SWL teachers' portal to enable them to assist students to find a placement in their area of interest. It also enables them to prepare students for their first contact with the employer.

Other ways to support our programs to prepare young people's transition from school to the workplace include:

- Participate in our events such as Career Expos
- Career Seminars and Real Industry Job Interviews
- Register as a School Industry Guest Speaker
- Share stories about your pathway via our online presentations
- Provide access to career practitioners to gain a better understanding of your industry
- Offer School Based Apprenticeships & Traineeships.

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
