INVIGOR8ING EDUCATION

Whittlesea: Year 8 students participate in a special semester program to encourage active engagement in education. Two streams available: Community/Leisure and Trade. Limited numbers. Available semester 1 and semester 2.

Hume: Year 8 students have the opportunity to participate in a special program over Terms 2 and 3 at Kangan Institute to encourage active engagement in education through a range of vocational education short courses. Referrals essential.

VIC VICE

VIRTUAL REALITY CAREERS EXPERIENCE

VIC VICE is a virtual reality platform that will allow students to experience different workplaces, particularly the hard to reach industries. VIC VICE features 2 types of content including 360 degree video with interactive touch points and Video-game style simulations and activities.

Work Window: Job Interview Simulator is a virtual reality platform that assists with preparations for job interviews. Work Window: Career Exploration is a video platform for students to explore options in a variety of work places. Schools can now loan the headsets for in house programs. Bookings are essential.

HUME VET CLUSTER

The Hume VET Cluster is a partnership between secondary schools across the Government, Catholic, and Independent sectors, local TAFEs, Registered Training Organisations (RTOs), and the Hume Whittlesea Local Learning and Employment Network (LLEN).

VET Clusters work collaboratively to increase access to Vocational Education and Training Delivered to School Students (VETDSS) by sharing resources and expertise. VDSS supports students to build real skills, connect with industry, and explore meaningful career pathways.
